Letter from the Headteacher



Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been really lovely to welcome all the children back this week. They've settled back into school life quickly and have shown a great attitude to learning as they start their new topics. You can find out more about what your children will be learning this term [on our website](#).

I hope you found the parent and carers' evenings helpful. It is always good to have the opportunity to talk with you about your children, and we really value the support you give them at home - it makes a genuine difference. We are also looking to book open morning sessions later in the summer term, where the children will have the opportunity to share and celebrate the excellent work they have completed throughout the year.

Although this is a short term, there is still lots going on. For our Year 6 children, a key event will be the Key Stage 2 tests (SATs), which take place in the week beginning 11th May. The children have worked hard throughout the year, and we are very proud of the effort they have put in.

We know that tests can feel daunting for some children, so we do our best to keep everything as calm and supportive as possible. This includes thinking carefully about where children sit and how we talk about the tests, with the focus firmly on doing their best rather than worrying about results.

Other statutory assessments taking place during the summer term include the Year 1 phonics screening check (second week of June) and the Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (first two weeks of June).

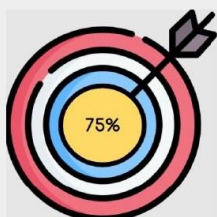

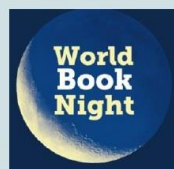



National Year of Reading



Book your place by Tuesday 28 April 2026

Courses are no cost to learners who meet our eligibility criteria. Learners must be aged 19+ years old on 31 August 2025, have a Wiltshire postcode, and meet residency requirements. Learners must also be able to tick **one** of the following criteria: individual income less than £25,750 a year; in receipt of benefits (other than child benefit); be a care leaver, foster carer or carer; be a military family or ex-armed forces personnel; have refugee or asylum seeker status; have a learning difficulty or disability; be looking to work, now or in the future.

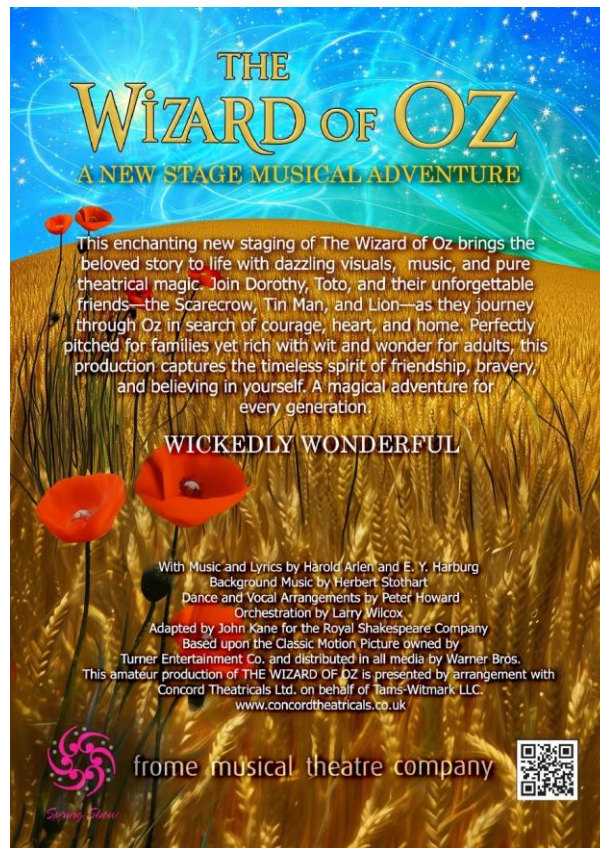
