Dear Parents and Carers,

Education Review

We were delighted to receive such positive feedback from EQUA Mead Trust following our recent Education Review. Visitors described our school as wonderful, lovely and delightful, noting a calm, purposeful learning environment, strong behaviour and clear routines. They highlighted the trust and strong relationships across the school, alongside happy, engaged and well-regulated pupils. Staff were praised for their enthusiasm, high expectations and clear sense of purpose. We are incredibly proud that this feedback reflects the daily commitment of our pupils, staff and families.

Mobile Phone Policy 2026-27

National evidence and government guidance show that mobile phones in schools negatively affect children's learning, well-being and behaviour. Following guidance from the government, EQUA Mead has created a new trust-wide mobile phone policy, which starts from September 2026.

Here are the key points:

- Primary schools are mobile-phone free. Children must not bring mobile phones or smart devices to school, including smartwatches.
- This rule applies from entering the school gate until leaving at the end of the school day.
- Exceptions are very rare and can only be approved by the Headteacher or the Trust CEO, in writing.
- If an exception is agreed, the phone must be handed to the school office on arrival, kept switched off all day, and collected at the end of the day.
- If parents need to contact their child during the school day, they should contact the school office directly.
- Phones brought into school without permission will be confiscated and must be collected by a parent or carer.
- Parents are asked to support this policy and make alternative arrangements for before and after-school communication.

School Office

The school office operates during designated hours to support parents, carers, pupils, and visitors with administrative enquiries.

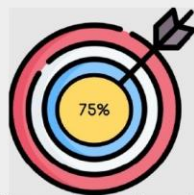
